## FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Members and Friends,



We are moving into a month when music fitting the season plays the biggest role of anytime during the year. With our new hymnal, “Glory to God,” we will have our old favorites along with some new expressions (that may become favorites in the years ahead). Before we get into the Christmas music, think of the tunes of some of the most popular Advent hymns. Such hymns as “O Come, O Come, Emmanuel,” “Creator of the Stars of Night,” and “Watchman, Tell Us of the Night” each have tunes that express a longing, a yearning. Advent is a season when we express our deep desire for the fullness of God’s presence to make things right externally and internally. The Christmas hymn tunes typically sound quite different from the Advent hymns. Some that celebrate the birth of the Christ child vary from being quiet and reflective to joyous and full-volume. “Away in a Manger,” “What Child Is This,” and “Silent Night, Holy Night” fall in the first category. “Joy to the World,” “Hark! The Herald Angels Sing,” and “Go, Tell It on the Mountain” fit into the latter.

The variety of tunes of these hymns speaks to the range of experience we have over the four weeks of Advent and in the celebration of the birth of our Lord. As we think about Advent candles to be lit and greenery to be hung, many of us are filled with a richness of memories and anticipation, joy and poignancy. The assortment of music helps give expression to a range of feelings and to a breadth of theological concepts. Think if there was only one tune we could use for any Advent or Christmas hymn. Or imagine that the words could only be expressed in an absolute monotone. That wouldn’t work, would it?

There will be ample opportunity for listening and singing during this month of December. Many different feelings will be evoked. I hope and pray that you won’t have a monotone Advent and Christmas, but will let the richness of the music match the richness of the meaning to have your heart and soul dance in response.

**Beginning on Monday, December 2**, all Warner members and friends are invited to take home a stocking hung on the mantel located on the stage in the Warner Social Hall. No later than December 21, exchange the paper stocking for either a pair of new adult women's socks and/or a pair of new socks sized for pre-schoolers, either white or blue (the school we are donating socks to is a Charter School where children wear uniforms) --- and leave them in the box marked **Christmas Stockings**, located on the stage in the Social Hall. The adult socks will be given to the women of Rainbow Place Shelter and the children's socks will go to the pre-schoolers of Crossway Community in Kensington.


## USHERING IN THE HOLIDAY SEASON


The Salt-Shakers are holding their Christmas party and gift exchange at the Daughertys' home at 6 p.m. on Saturday, December 7.
